We had 25 kids and almost as many volunteers! This year's theme was Camp Jerusalem - Heroes and Sheroes. We highlighted Moses, Esther, David and of course, Jesus. We celebrated each Hero and Shero with a re-enactment by our own Pastor Kathryn. She rocked each character - however, she could have won an Oscar for her portrayal of Queen Esther, and Bob as Mordecai, was a real hoot! One of our favorite nights was Wednesday night when the kids were treated to dunking the Pharaoh and Goliath (both Rick Anderson) in the dunk tank. We weren't sure if we were going to be able to have VBS outside due to impending storms. Well - we prayed and a window of opportunity presented itself and we had so much fun trying to dunk Rick, and even Ed Brader got into the act! At the end of the evening the kids went into the field and we launched water balloons toward each other, then chaos broke out as there was a free for all water balloon battle including staff and parents. The evening ended with a sweet gentle rain where we all laughed as we went into Ryman Hall for a wrap up of the evening. God's is Good. All the time!! As part of VBS the kids participated in a mission where tie blankets were assembled. This bag would be great to take along on trips or while waiting at the doctor's office. The kids at VBS assembled the items and were given the option of keeping the item or donating to the bag. All I can say is our kids have the biggest hearts when it comes to giving of themselves. We are blessed as a congregation to have such amazing, loving kids in our midst.

Now for the upcoming school year! Some of our kids will be entering 7th grade and will be going to church and Confirmation class. The kids who are entering 1st grade will join us in

Sunday School. We are requesting that the kids in First Grade sit in the church service until after the Children's Message. 
#### **REGISTER RECEIPTS**
