CONGREGATIONAL CONVERSATIONS (August – September 2020)

As Pastor Kathryn began her sabbatical, and after discussion with Rev. Dr. Bonnie Bates (Penn Northeast Conference Minister), the decision was made to hold small group meetings to gather feedback from the congregation regarding the future of Jerusalem UCC. The meetings would be run by volunteers (of varying ages and a mix of men and women) who would undergo training on facilitating meetings and developing questions. The purpose of the exercise was to understand how the congregation wants to move forward. The intent is to compare this information to Pastor Kathryn's learnings during her time of self-reflection and determine whether there is a common path ahead.

Nine Facilitators volunteered to be part of this process (Shelba Scheffner, Beverly Waibel, Marcia Heinick, Charlie & Kirby LaSala, Paul Rice, Wendy Hoppel, and Matthew & Elise Binder.) Throughout the month of August and into early September, meetings were held at a variety of times and on different days of the week to accommodate schedules. Feedback was also collected by phone when requested to assure input was received from as much of the congregation as possible. A total of 97 members provided feedback. An overview of the information follows.

Question 1: What brought you to Jerusalem UCC? What keeps you coming back? The largest pool of respondents answered that they are here because of family and consider JUCC their home church. Additionally, many mentioned coming to JUCC because people are welcoming and friendly, and they feel like they belong. The next highest response called out coming specifically because of Pastor Kathryn, followed by answers mentioning location or proximity as a key factor. Other mentions included the Contemporary service, activities / volunteering, the music, sermons, and Sunday School.

Question 2: Jerusalem UCC participates in mission work – what do you support, and what do you think is missing?

The largest response to this question was a general support for all missions and a feeling that none are missing. Beyond this were mentions of support for CACPAC, Food Drives, VBS, and the Coat Drive. Many other missions were mentioned and there was some sentiment to keep missions local.

Question 3: How do you feel about our pastor's spiritual leadership? What areas for growth / development do you see?

The leading number of responses indicated general support for Pastor Kathryn's efforts, and the next most common response referenced good messages / sermons. Personal outreach (especially in times of need) to members was called out positively, and members described

her as knowledgeable about the Bible. For areas of growth and development, leading responses pointed to a need for improved communication and a need to be more approachable. There were also mentions of a need to be less defensive and to be better at managing conflict, and to unite the congregation through more positivity. Some called out a need to work more collaboratively with the governing body.

Ouestion 4: Considering the politically-charged climate of today, how should the pastor and congregation manage the church's role in addressing social issues like poverty, racism, and matters of social justice?

Members overwhelmingly responded that the church should keep politics out. Another significant response was that we should lead through the Bible, not personal views. The next most common response was "All are welcome here." Some members suggested giving the Biblical perspective on current events, followed by mentions of leading by example / educating / creating awareness.

Question 5: What are the biggest challenges Jerusalem UCC is facing?

The first concern mentioned was participation / membership / attendance followed closely by Covid-19. Other challenges referenced included: the absence of a pastor, money, communication, building project concerns, and division.

Question 6: Where do you hope Jerusalem UCC will be in 3 years?

Members responded that they hope JUCC will be growing & have more youth, and they hope the building project will be complete. An additional group mentioned hoping to be back inside the church with resumed activities. Also mentioned were evaluating UCC fit and showing improved communication.

A tremendous amount of information was gathered during this exercise. This overview provides only trend data and not detailed data. We appreciate all of you who took the time to participate in this valuable survey. Thank you for your support.




COME WORSHIP WITH US EACH SUNDAY IN THE CHURCH GROVE AT 10:30 AM.
