MESSAGE FROM THE CONSISTORY PRESIDENT DECEMBER 2021

Hello Fellow Church Members and Future Church Members,

Well, another month has passed us by, and things sure seem to be moving fast this year. We had our Fall Bazaar and Basket Social, and we did very well with that event. We sold out of food, and there was a great number of people that came and participated in the basket raffle. We had plenty of help as always. We went right from that into our Fall Filling Sale. What a successful event that turned out to be! We thought we'd make around 1200 pounds, and we ended up making 1525 pounds of filling. On Friday we prepped everything, and had around 18 people out that day. Then Saturday morning, we started at around 6:30 a.m. cooking the potatoes, celery, and onions, and by 8 a.m. we were ready to start mixing. We're not sure exactly how many total people showed up on Saturday, as people came and went as they needed to, but at one point, we counted 31 that were there cooking, mixing, filling pans, and sealing them. Thanks to everyone who came out again to help with this fundraiser. 2021 will end up being our best fundraising year every, so again I want to thank everyone who came out during the year to help out. We always end up having all the help we need. We will once again be having two Christmas Eve services this year: 5 p.m. in the Grove (weather permitting), and 7 p.m. in the sanctuary. We will be lighting the grove with lights again this year. We tried to do it last year, and ended up having a very strong storm with lots of rain and high winds, and weren't able to do it. This year, we did our Operation Christmas Child shoe boxes for kids, and filled 50 boxes. Last year, we only did 7, so we were very excited about the overwhelming support we received from our members. We've also been collecting money for Thanksgiving and Christmas dinners again this year. We supplied 5 families with Thanksgiving dinners, and are taking reservations up to Monday, December 6th for Christmas dinners. If you know of anyone in need, please have them call the Church office. We had our annual Operation Warm a Child coat drive for kids, and collected around 30 coats for local kids. Starting in January, we're going to start having Movie Nights for families in our Church sanctuary. More information to follow on that in the next newsletter. Hoping to see you all in Church over the Christmas season. The Church sure is beautiful this time of year.


