MESSAGE FROM THE CONSISTORY PRESIDENT OCTOBER 2022



Greetings,

It's amazing how quickly this past summer season has passed by; the Flea Market in June, our Annual Picnic in August, the Search Committee's tireless efforts in finding Pastor Marian and the Festival in September. Right around the corner at the same time you receive this Newsletter we will be finishing our October Applefest, we will have a November Basket Social as well as our Filling sale all in this glorious season of Autumn! No time to sit back and rest here in Trachsville! There are so many people who cannot physically help at these events but they find other ways to contribute. While I could write a story on many of our members that contribute behind the scenes (and I think I will in the future) there is one person that stands out . . .

For The Love Of Edna

Edna Schoenberger was a long time member of our church and for our members that did not know her, these few facts might jog your memory as to who she was. Every Sunday Kelli George picked her up and brought her to church, since she passed her house anyway, and Kelli can tell you all about the most delightful conversations they would have. She came into the church and took her seat to left side, about one third up towards the front of the church and sat on the end of the aisle by the stained-glass windows. Edna was typical Pennsylvania Dutch (as many of our senior citizens are in our church) which means no nonsense and what you see, is what you get! They are dedicated, hardworking, love their families, love their God and this church and when you earn their trust, you will be their friend forever. This was Edna to a T!

My first exposure to Edna was when I took over the Raffle Ticket drawing at our church picnic, prior to that, Blanche Strausberger was always in charge of the drawing. When I put an article in the bulletin, in the newsletter or made an announcement in church about once again needing items for the raffle ticket, it was always Edna that approached me first and said "Hey, I have a bedspread for you again, now it's not a quilt, it's an embroidered bedspread, make sure you put that down, do you know the difference between them?" I actually did think I knew the difference, but with respect to her and I also knew a little about embroidery but not too much of quilting, I said no. Of course, she proceeded to tell me! So, she starts to create separate squares first, embroidering each square one at a time. She puts so much time and thought into every bedspread she ever made. One year she made all 50 States, one year she made all flowers, one year was all Disney characters, every year was a special and unique design. I asked her where she got all her ideas from, she said sometimes her kids or grandkids gave her ideas, sometimes she read or saw something on TV or in the paper or a magazine and left the creative ability take over. This last quilt she made was 36 separate squares, I could be wrong, but I think the bedspreads were different sizes from year to year, pending the theme. Hours upon hours went into each creation. After all the squares are completed, they all get a border put around them and the bedspread comes to life as each square is put into place, the backing is then added and as Edna says "then it's done". Sounds so simple! Because Edna was always the first person to tell me about her donation, I always had her quilt, I mean Bedspread, as the first prize on the raffle ticket. She told me one year that I didn't have to list that as the first prize every year because it wasn't the most important item on the ticket. I told her in my opinion it was a very important prize because these handmade items will soon be a thing of the past and items such as these will be rare.

In the beginning of this 2022 year, Edna's struggle with cancer started to take its toll. In all the months that she continued to attend church, she never complained about her pain or discomfort but simply would say "You know I have cancer, it's all over my body now". I would marvel at her courage since most of us saw this very busy woman running her home, taking care of her family and also being very active in the Polk Twp. Ladies Auxiliary, now somewhat moving slower and looking a little frail. One Sunday in March she told me she had a Bedspread made for me this year already, since she starts on the next one as soon as she finishes the prior one. It keeps her busy she told me; it gives her something to do to take her mind off her troubles. By the end of April, Edna's health worsened, she lost her vigilant battle to cancer and now walks with Jesus every day. Jerusalem UCC lost an absolute angel and we were all the better people knowing her as a friend. But the story continues. . . In keeping with her promise and her wishes, her daughter Annie reached out to Kelli and delivered The Bedspread to us prior to our July Consistory meeting. With tears rolling down her checks Annie told us the story of Edna's last days and said Annie had to remember to get the Filling that she ordered before Easter and to make sure the church got the bedspread before the picnic. Annie also shared with us that her daughter Angie (Edna's granddaughter) thought maybe they should keep this one and not give it away to the church, since it was the last bedspread Edna made. In keeping with the promise to Edna however, they felt torn handing it over to us. With tears rolling down my cheeks, I accepted it with honor and said maybe all the stars will align, luck and God's miracles, someone in your family will win it. I must have told this story to every member of our church that I was in contact with or that looked at the bedspread on our picnic day and I think every member said if they would win it, they would give it back to the family. This year I did not list Edna's prize bedspread on the raffle ticket but as the first prize in our Tricky Tray drawing. I did that for many reasons, the most important one being that whoever won it, would really want it, not merely winning it by chance with no choice on the item. Edna's family did not win, the lucky winner was Marcia Heinick. This dear lady Marcia immediately said it was to be given back to the family. To make an even longer story a little bit shorter, it took us a few weeks to contact the family due to none working numbers and finally we (Marcia and I) connected with daughter Annie and granddaughter Angie here in our church. We all shed many tears as they told us stories of their dear Edna, her last days and her last minutes here on this earth and we told them our stories of our dear Edna in this church. They will be forever grateful to our church, especially Marcia, to have the last Bedspread Edna made, back in their homes within their family. We were most humbled and honored to gift this special bedspread back to them, for it will be warming their hearts, their bodies and their souls for many years. . . All for the love of Edna.





