We had to "eat something decent for the day" so onto the kitchen stand which was always a Chicken Bar BQ with pickle cabbage on top. Maybe later we got a Cheeseburger or Hot Dog with relish! As you can see food was the highlight of the day! For some reason I don't remember playing games or the Kiddie Cakewalk, but I know we had them. But I certainly remember the Big Cakewalk at night. We would save our nickels and dimes and put them in a bag to bring along to the picnic to hopefully win a cake that night. Many years we had well over 200 items of cakes and watermelons and all the ladies (and kids too) would walk around the tables to view all the baked creations. I remember hearing complaints that the people "just don't walk" and they should rename it the Trachsville Cake Stand instead! Depending on your age and how long you have been attending our legendary Trachsville Picnics, you might share some of the same

memories that I have but I'm sure you all have your own special favorites. I highlighted my favorite memories as a child, but my favorite memories as an adult are being able to walk around the entire grove and see all the people walking in with their chairs, carrying a sweater (that's telling me they plan to stay for the night) and simply meandering and mingling with each other. Christian Education News for August 2023

We held Vacation Bible School this year from July 18-July 20, 2023, from 6-8pm in the Grove and in Ryman Hall. This year's theme was "Caring for God's Creation" where we learned to care for animals, the Earth and each other. We served a total of 22 children. Seven of those children were in our "Littles" Program where the parents stayed with them. Two of the children were non-members but relatives. Of the fifteen children in the Sunday School age program all were either members, considering membership or related to a member. We had 8 Youth Helpers and 19 adults who helped with the activities, food set-up or food / activity clean-up.

The first night we learned a fun song and made dog biscuits. "Littles" decorated containers for the biscuits and the Sunday School aged kids rolled out the biscuit dough. All the while, kids had the opportunity to play kick ball and they tried their hardest to get Rick Anderson and Riley Bonser wet with water during water games. Halfway through the evening the kids had a snack and then Pastor Marian gave a beautiful fun message complete with dancing in a circle praising the beauty before us, behind us, around us and in us. Most adults, youth and kids all joined in! To keep with the theme of caring for animals, they were able to use a sling shot to launch fruits and vegetables into the woods. Rachael was able to procure the unsaleable fruit from Shoprite. All had a great time! Lots of laughter and encouragement. Also, to go with the theme, we were able to collect lots of donations for cat and dog shelters in the area. I was able to take the dog donations to Awesome Pet Rescue of Monroe County. They were very excited with the dog biscuits!! And of course, the generosity of our congregation. Rachael will take the cat donations to a local cat rescue in Carbon County. The 2nd night the kids immediately started painting pots and planting succulents that will be given to our Home Heroes and some people in the congregation took them home on Sunday. They also decorated the "On the Go bags" that will be used to hold food and care items for people who reach out to Pastor Marian and are in need of short-term sustenance. The congregation and VBS participants donated enough items to substantially fill 11 bags. The 2nd night was also water play night and all who

wanted to get wet got soaked and even those who were not so willing got a bit wet (3). After water play, we had a snack and then the kids could play Dodge Ball, make a bird feeder, a bracelet from recycled bags or make a sensory bottle. The Sensory Bottle was a bit of a fiasco as the glue was too

old and was very viscus, lots of "ewwwwwws" were heard (3) We ended the night around the new Dogwood tree presented in honor of our VBS. We added mulch and Pastor Marian led us in singing and dancing around the tree as it received lots of love and blessings. Thanks to Rick Anderson for his connections and getting the tree planted.

The last night, families gathered, and we had a potluck supper as a way to care for each other. The kids and parents painted rocks that will be put at the base of the Dogwood Tree. Families played games and just socialized with each other. Pastor Marian had another meeting at the tree and I heard the song "Oh Christmas Tree" in the background as I was still in the Grove.

It was a beautiful few days, not only because of the weather but because of the Spirit that was with us through VBS. I am in awe of the kindness and willingness for people to step in and up when it comes to the kids and missions. My prayer is that the kids remember the feeling they receive when they come to VBS and church, that they remember having great times and a feeling of being safe, secure and deeply loved as they give of themselves and others give of themselves for the kids. We are truly blessed!
